Division of Vocational Rehabilitation **State FY2021 – Program Highlights**



Mission of DVR: To assist individuals with disabilities to obtain and maintain employment

- 1,785 individuals received services from the VR program.
- 497 students with disabilities were served as potentially eligible.
- \$2,835,575 was spent on services to clients in the VR program.
- **606** new individuals applied for VR services; and a total of 1,510 individuals received information and referral services.
- **92%** of individuals receiving services experienced significant disabilities with multiple barriers to employment.
- **251** individuals exited the program employed with an average wage of \$16.16 an hour.
 - o 198 were employed in the private sector;
 - o 47 were employed in Federal, State, or Local government;
 - o **6** were self-employed.
- 543 students with disabilities received Pre-Employment Transition Services.
- \$1,064,650 was spent on Pre-Employment Transition Services.
